

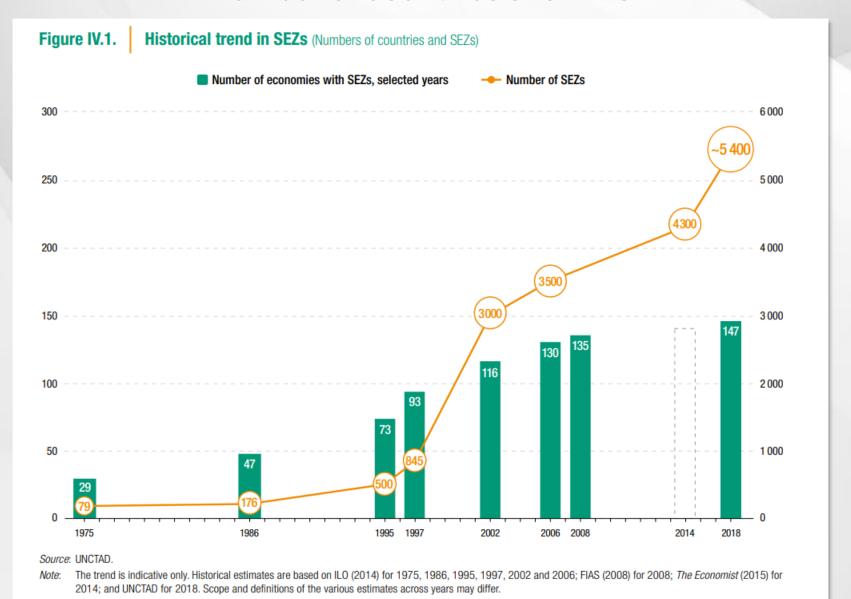

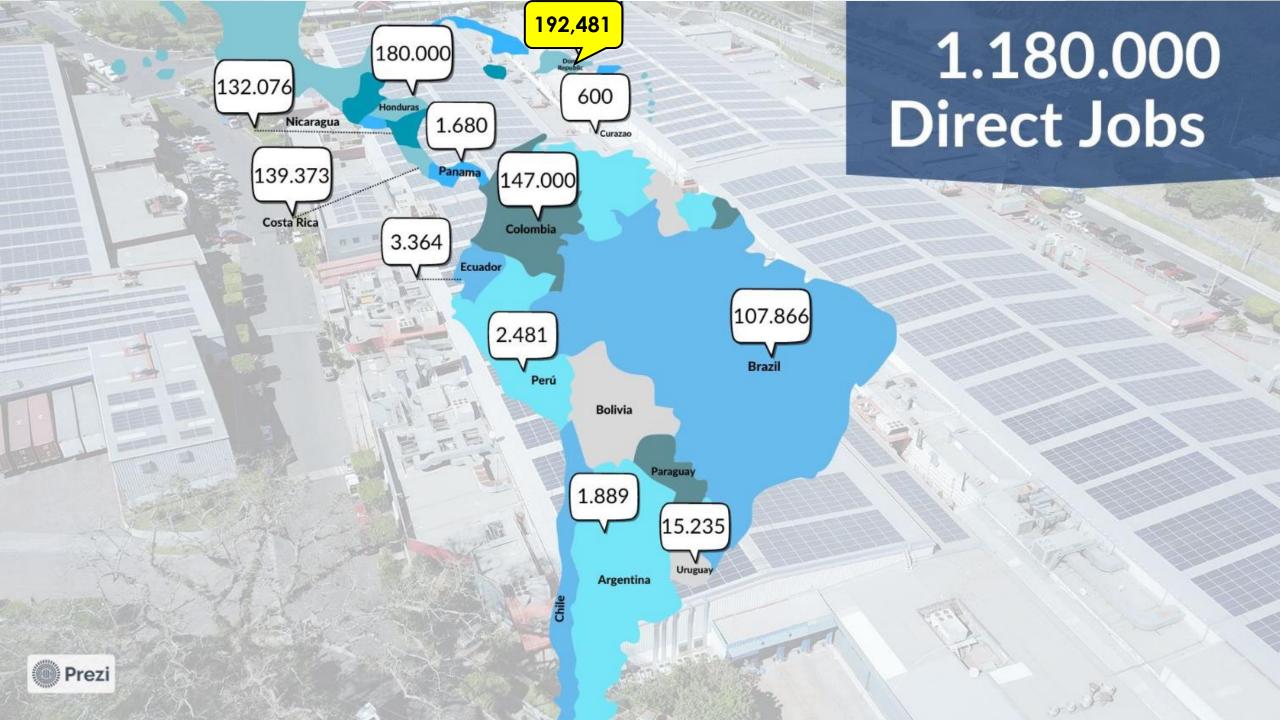

WHY DOMINICAN REPUBLIC?



ECONOMIC & POLITICAL STABILITY

The DR is one of the fastest growing economies in the Latin America, recognized for its political and social stability.



TRADE AGREEMENTS

Free trade agreements with more than 40 countries, allowing access to more than 1,000 million consumers around the world, including the United States, the European Union, America Central and Caribbean.



CONNECTIVITY

The country has one of the best logistics infrastructures in Latin America, including 9 international airports and 13 seaports, with access to the main destinations in the world.



LICENSES & PERMITS

The process of application, approval and installation of free zone companies in the Dominican Republic is characterized by being agile and expeditious.



HUMAN CAPITAL

Great source of talent in the technical and professional areas, undergraduate and graduate, focused on STEM and administrative careers.



FISCAL REGIME

100% exemption from municipal and national taxes.



- Income Tax
- Value added tax (ITBIS)
- Import taxes
- Selective tax on insurance, fuel and others
- Tax on patents, assets and wealth

Exemptions applicable during the entire period of operation of the company, renewable every 15 years.

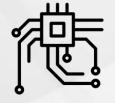

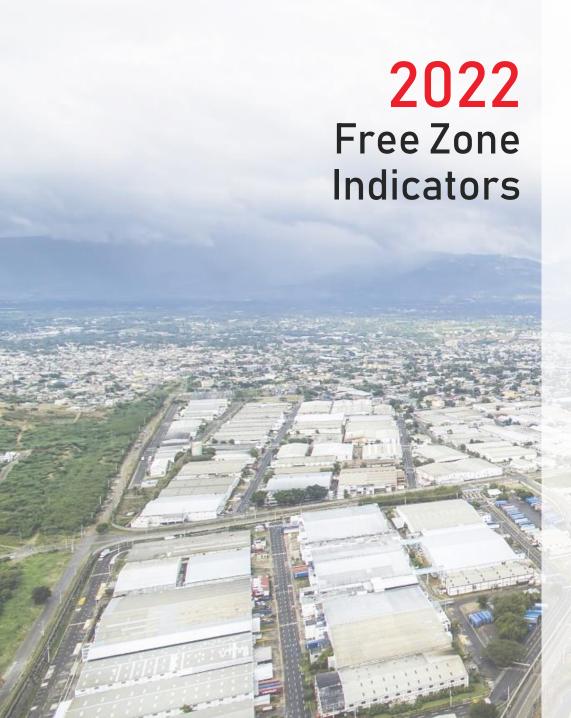

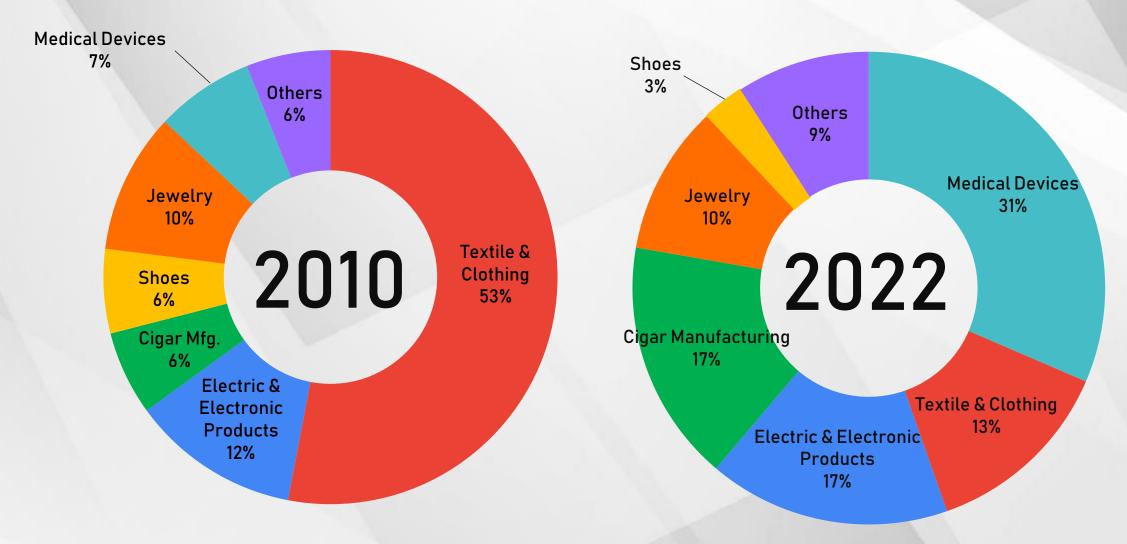

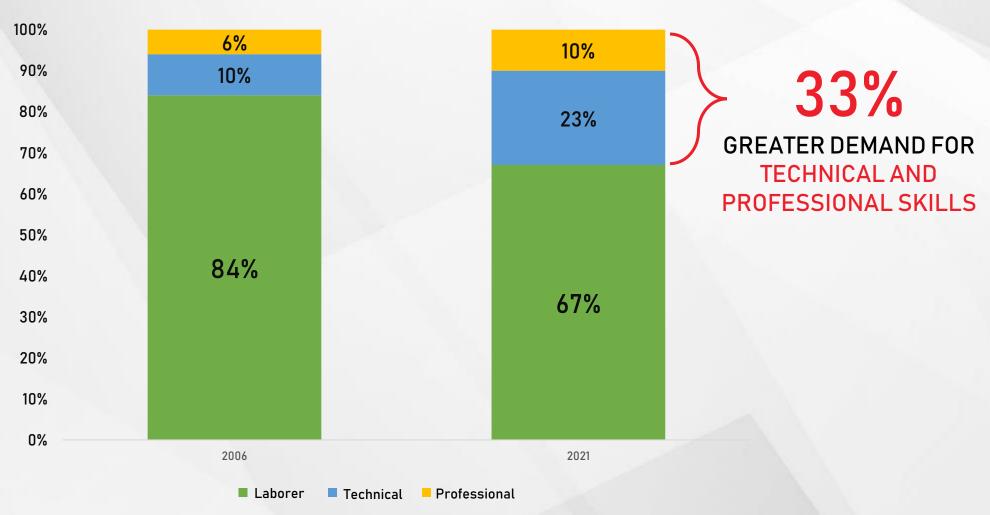

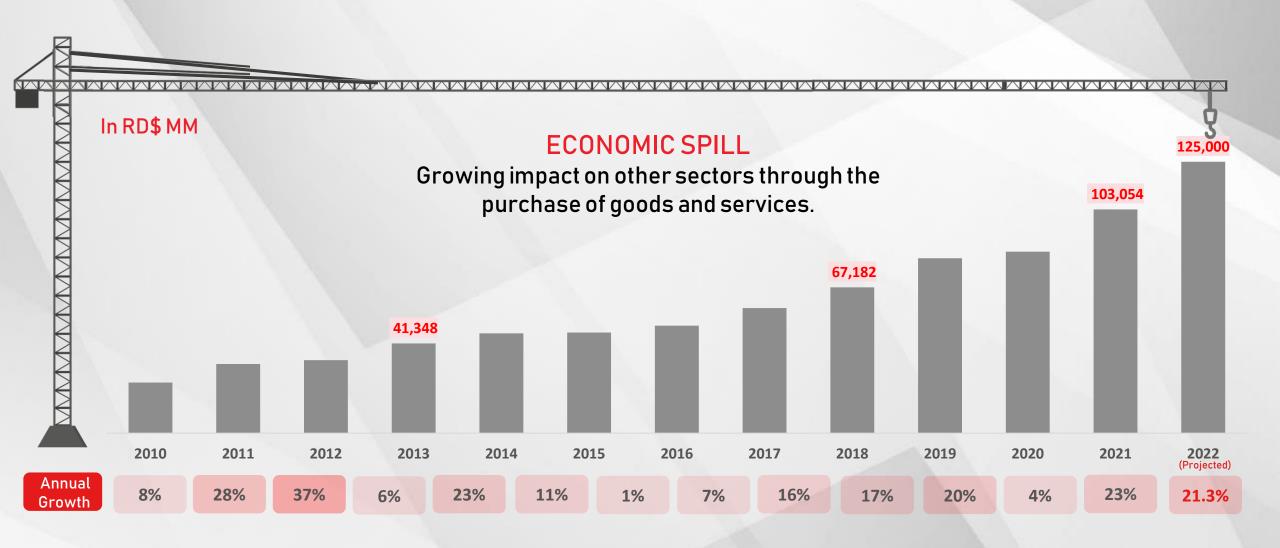

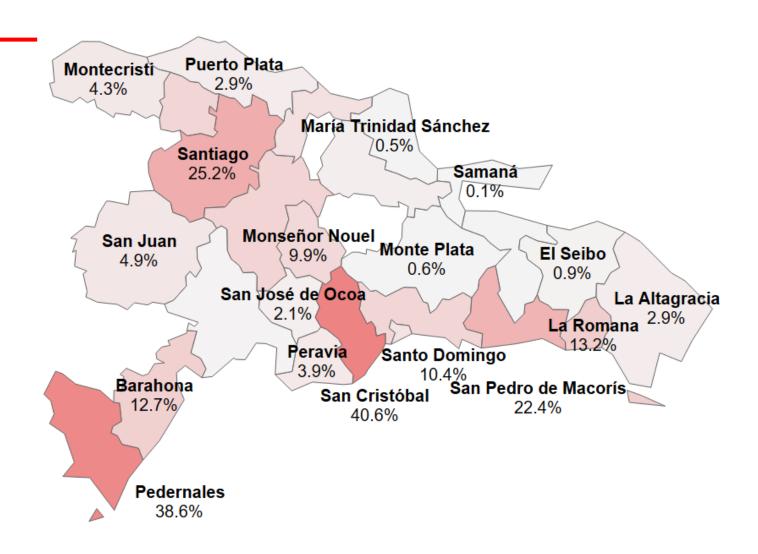


FREE ZONES EMPLOYMENT

Free Trade Zones concentrate up to 40% of formal private employment in provinces such as San Cristóbal and Pedernales.

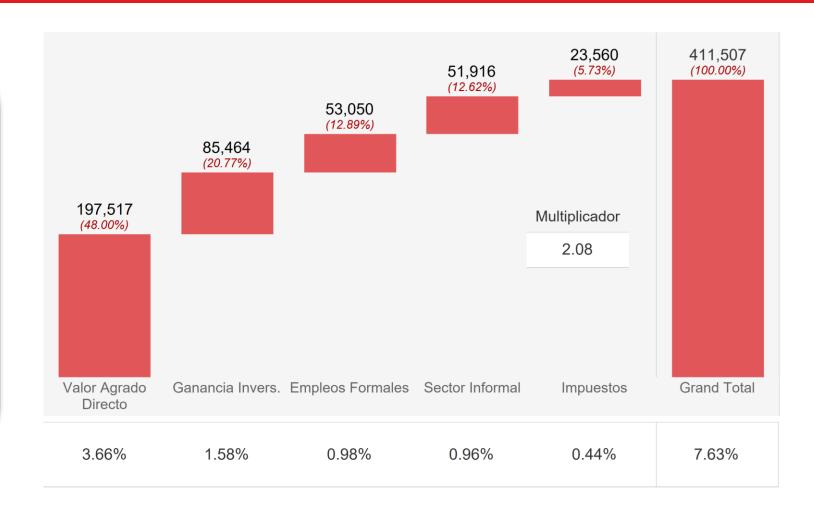
In Santiago and San Pedro de Macorís, free zones represent 25.2% and 22.4% of total formal employment.



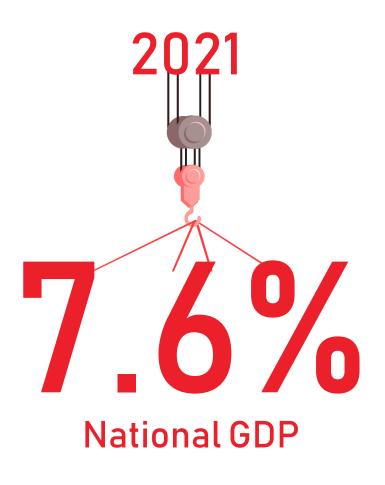
TOTAL GDP IMPACT

(To Impact Receivers, in RD\$ MM - 2021)

- The spillover effect of Free Zones is distributed throughout the value chain and the purchasing power of employees throughout the chain
- While 48% impacted investors and employees of the sector, 20.7% was received by investors from other sectors, 6% was received directly and indirectly by the treasury and the rest impacted the homes of other formal and informal workers



DIRECT & INDIRECT ECONOMIC IMPACT



The total impact of Free Zones in the GDP is as follows:

Contributing 3%f household consumption and %%ll investments
